# Report on the Use of the Trust Fund named "His Royal Highness Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa"



#### **Introduction**

Prince of Songkla University had the great honor and privilege to confer an Honorary Doctorate Degree in Political Science to His Royal Highness Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Bahrain, on August 13, 2009. On this occasion, His Royal Highness graciously made a generous donation of US \$1,000,000 to the university, a caring support that PSU later named it "His Royal Highness Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa Trust Fund".

### **General Objectives**

His Royal Highness' considerate financial provision was used to support charitable activities, starting with the fiscal year 2010, under six objectives:

- 1. to support financially children from poor and underprivileged families in rural areas, under the PSU's Saplings Scholarships, to study until the completion of their Bachelor's degrees at PSU
- 2. to subsidize activities under PSU's guiding principle "Our soul is for the benefit of mankind"
- 3. to strengthen education for students in need at PSU
- 4. to provide scholarships to PSU Pattani Campus students in order to conduct cooperative studies in the Middle East
- 5. to sponsor graduate students to write a thesis with a subject related to Bahrain
- 6. to provide funds for initiating research collaboration networks with universities in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

PSU uses this fund to sustain these six altruistic projects, which hopefully meet His Royal Highness' principles of "goodness, justice, cooperation and peaceful co-existence between all the people of the world". Also, these projects are concurrent with the motto and belief of our university that places "the benefit of mankind" as our first priority, above our own needs.



## **Details of the Use of the Trust Fund**



#### **Objective 1:**

To support financially children from poor and underprivileged families in rural areas, under the PSU's Saplings Scholarships, to study until the completion of their Bachelor's degrees at PSU.

The first project, named the PSU's Saplings Scholarships, supports children, both Muslims and Buddhists, from poor and underprivileged families in rural areas by granting them scholarships to study up until completion of their Bachelor's degree at PSU. Each student receives 29,000 Baht per year before enrolling to PSU. Afterwards, they will receive 40,000 Baht per year during their studies at PSU. Tuition fee will be exempted and accommodation at PSU dormitories will be provided for them during their studies.

The Saplings program started out in 2010, by offering scholarships to two students from secondary schools in southern provinces, in order to support their studies until their Bachelor's degree at PSU. Subsequently, one additional student received scholarship support each year. Since 2015, two new students are accepted into the Saplings scholarship program each year.

In 2017, at the time of publication, there are a total of ten students who got financial assistance under this project, as shown in Table 1.



#### **Outcome**

To date, a total of ten students received financial assistance under the PSU Saplings Scholarships project. #### **Objective 2:**

#### To subsidize activities under PSU's guiding principle "Our soul is for the benefit of mankind"

In 2010-2012, an annual budget of 100,000 Baht per year has been provided from the trust fund in order to support activities under this objective. The total amount has been shared between the five campuses in order to arrange altruistic activities. In 2016, a budget of 3,000,000 Baht has been provided in order to fund the Bahrain Study & Self Learning Center in Pattani. Following are details of the activities arranged at the PSU campuses.

#### **Outcome**

2010-2012: Numerous activities under this objective were organized from 2010-2012 by the five campuses of PSU, including rural development projects, community services, Southern Thailand environment preservation, and charitable activities.

In 2013, the PSU's trust fund meeting committee has proposed to modify the guidelines for fiscal year 2014, to carry out new projects that more closely reflect the Program's aims, a broader benefit to the public.

By the year 2016, the Meeting has resolved to approve funding for the establishment of a Bahrain Study & Self Learning Center in the amount of 3,000,000 Baht, to be built on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Office of Academic Resources (Building 22), at PSU's Pattani Campus. The room is planned to contain bookshelves, a sitting area to read books, an area to search for information about Bahrain Study by using tablet computers, an exhibition presenting the information with multimedia, and a relaxation corner. The Center is expected to be finished by February 2017. The proposed plan ensures that the project will be continuous and sustainable in the future.

Again, PSU is highly obliged to His Royal Highness Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa for the generous patronage of these altruistic activities. PSU is looking forward to develop even more activities under this objective, with larger reach to communities in remote areas of the southern region.

#### **Objective 3:**

#### To strengthen education for students in need at PSU

Since 2010, PSU provides scholarships of 50,000 Baht per year per recipient, in order to help students in need to complete their Bachelor's degree studies. The details of the recipients coming from underprivileged families are as follows:

#### **Outcome**

Currently, PSU provides eighteen scholarships to poor students on all five campuses, in order to help them complete their Bachelor's degree studies. Every year, one additional student in need per campus will receive the financial assistance under this objective. Moreover, there are 3 recipients who graduated and successfully found employment.



#### **Objective 4:**

## To provide scholarships to PSU Pattani Campus students in order to conduct cooperative studies in the Middle East

The previous aim of Objective 4 was defined as "fostering collaboration with universities in Bahrain". Accordingly, PSU has provided ten scholarships for students (240,000 Baht each) to study at a university in Bahrain for one semester. Students can study in Bahrain for one semester and transfer the credits back to PSU. In 2016, the PSU's Trust Fund meeting committee has refined the focus of this objective, to award two scholarships to PSU Pattani Campus students in order to conduct cooperative studies in the Middle East. The 140,000 Baht scholarship covers travel costs, accommodation, and other expenses. In academic year 2016, the two selected scholarship recipients participate in cooperative education at the Royal Thai Embassy in Manama, the Kingdom of Bahrain. The details are as follows:

#### **Objective 5:**

#### To sponsor graduate students to write a thesis with a subject related to Bahrain

The fifth project started in 2012, and offers financial support to graduate students, Master's or Ph.D. degree, to write a thesis with regard to any aspect related to the Kingdom of Bahrain. PSU provides 200,000 Baht per academic year from the Trust Fund to one recipient. This activity is still open for our students.

#### **Objective 6:**

#### To provide funds for initiating research collaboration networks with universities in the Kingdom of Bahrain

In order to promote the appreciation of the wonderful culture of the Kingdom of Bahrain, PSU has allocated 500,000 Baht per academic year for academic staff interested in doing research with subjects related to any aspect of the Kingdom of Bahrain. In 2016, the meeting committee refined the aim of this objective to providing funds in the amount of 200,000 Baht per academic year to academic staff for initiating research collaboration networks with universities in the Kingdom of Bahrain. The purpose of the new initiative is to facilitate international research and exchange knowledge with researchers abroad. This objective was announced to all campuses and is still open for our academic staff.



#### **Conclusion**


